

Civil War Field-Study Trip
Gettysburg, Thursday - Sunday, Oct. 30 – Nov. 2, 2014
Featuring Fred W. Kiger '74 ('77 MAT), lecturer

More than 10,000 military actions of one kind or another occurred during the America Civil War. Join us for a visit to one of the most significant. Our excursion begins on Thursday with at a stop at Guiney's Station – a site that had dire consequences for Robert E. Lee, for it was here Lt. General Thomas J. "Stonewall" Jackson died just weeks before the Army of Northern Virginia's second invasion of the North. That campaign led to Gettysburg, and we've plan a three-day tour for each day of that momentous battle.

Friday will be spent visiting the sites which made up the first day of the battle: Herr Ridge, McPherson's Ridge, Oak Hill and McPherson's Woods, where the 24th Michigan and the 26th North Carolina had one of the fiercest stand-up fights of the war.

On Saturday we'll make our way to the hallowed ground that made up the second day: Big and Little Round Top, Devil's Den, the Wheatfield, Cemetery Ridge, Cemetery Hill and Culp's Hill. We'll pay a special visit to one shady slope of Little Round Top where Colonel Joshua Lawrence Chamberlain's 20th Maine saved the left flank of the Federal Army of the Potomac.



On Sunday we'll follow powerful events right up to the moment when some 13,000 Confederates under Lt. General James Longstreet made one of the most famous and hopeless charges in American history. We'll reenact that march.

Museums, insightful presentations, battlefield sites, living history, convenient lodging for browsing around town and excellent dining – all make for an education, entertaining and memorable trip to the battle that some believe was the turning point of the war. Enjoy meals at the historic Farnsworth House, Hickory Bridge and Fairfield Inn.

(Please be prepared for very hot and humid weather. This tour requires very extensive walking.)

Tuition: \$825; GAA members pay \$795 (based on double occupancy – additional \$210 for single room accommodations)

Tuition includes:

- Three nights lodging at the 1863 Inn of Gettysburg
- All site fees
- All meals in Gettysburg , including the historic Farnsworth House, Hickory Bridge and Fairfield Inn and more
 - o Lunch on the journey northbound and dinner on the return is on your own; the group will stop in both cases where there are multiple restaurants to choose from.
- Transportation to and from Chapel Hill
