

#### Program Highlights:

- Experience the diverse and unspoiled natural wilderness of our National Parks, accompanied by an Orbridge Expedition Leader.
- \* Overnight in landmark lodges that are national treasures themselves.
- \* Witness one of the world's largest free-roaming bison herds in Custer State Park and enjoy a chuck wagon cook-out.
- \* Marvel at the grandeur of Mount Rushmore, the Crazy Horse Memorial, and the world's largest mammoth site, where scientists are excavating remains of woolly mammoths from 26,000 years ago.
- \* View the natural wonders and geothermal features of Yellowstone National Park, such as Old Faithful Geyser and the Fountain Paint Pots Nature Trail.
- \* Relax: Included are nine nights accommodations, transport via a private deluxe motor coach, airport transfers (for guests arriving and departing on program dates), most meals (nine breakfasts, one lunch, and six dinners), and admission to all parks.



#### Day-by-Day Itinerary\*:

#### Day 1: Rapid City

Arrive in Rapid City and transfer to your hotel, where you will meet your expedition leader and traveling companions for a welcome drink and expedition briefing.

Overnight: Adoba Eco Hotel

Day 2: Rapid City, South Dakota / Badlands National Park / Custer State Park State Game Lodge Following breakfast, head to Badlands National Park, featuring some of the most spectacular scenery in the

region. Later in the afternoon, travel into the back country and enjoy a Buffalo Safari and Chuck Wagon Cookout. Tonight, stay in Custer State Game Lodge, built in 1920 and listed on the National Register of Historic Places. It served as the "Summer White House" for President Calvin Coolidge in 1927 and was visited by President Dwight D. Eisenhower in 1953.

Overnight: State Game Lodge (B,D)

#### Day 3: Custer State Park

This morning, travel to Hot Springs to visit the world's largest mammoth dig site. After a short tour, stroll on the boardwalk over the dig area and see the paleontology laboratory. Continue to work-in-progress Crazy Horse Memorial. Under construction since 1948, when completed it may become the world's largest sculpture. The remainder of the day is yours to enjoy in Custer State Park.

Overnight: State Game Lodge (B,D)

#### Day 4: Custer State Park / Spearfish Canyon

Today visit one of the world's largest stone monuments, the iconic Mount Rushmore. Spend the night deep in the heart of one of the most breathtakingly beautiful canyons in the world.

Overnight: Spearfish Canyon Lodge (B,D)

#### Day 5: U-Cross Ranch / Cody

Journey through scenic Spearfish Canyon and across the grassy plains of Wyoming. Enjoy lunch at an authentic Western Ranch. Cross the Bighorn Mountains to Buffalo Bill's Wild West town of Cody, Wyoming.

Overnight: The Cody Hotel (B,L)

#### Day 6-7: Cody / Yellowstone National Park / Mammoth Hot Springs

Visit Buffalo Bill Historical Center for a step into the West's rich past, including Western and Native American history, the life of W.F. "Buffalo Bill" Cody, Yellowstone, and old firearms. Continue on and pass through Shoshone National Forest to Yellowstone National Park, established in 1872 as the world's first national park. Watch in awe as Old Faithful Geyser erupts between heights of 106 to 185 feet. Take a guided walking tour of Fountain Paint Pots Nature Trail to witness all four types of geothermal features found throughout the world, including bubbling mud pots. Continue on to Mammoth Hot Springs, where steamy limestone terraces and hot springs overlook the visiting facilities. Perhaps visit the Albright Visitor Center and Museum.

Overnight: Old Faithful Inn and Mammoth Hot Springs Hotel (B,D)

#### Day 8: Yellowstone National Park / Grand Teton National Park / Jackson

Head south this morning through vast unspoiled wilderness to Grand Teton National Park, its jagged mountain peaks forming a perfect backdrop behind Jenny and Jackson Lakes. Continue on to the Western town of Jackson, Wyoming

Overnight: The Rustic Inn (B)

#### Day 9: Jackson

Today is yours to explore on your own. You may choose to wander into Jackson's lively town square and browse the local art galleries and boutiques or take part in a wide range of optional outdoor activities including horseback riding, fly fishing, or a float trip down the Snake River. This evening, enjoy a farewell dinner hosted by your Expedition Leader.

#### Rapid City

#### **Custer State Game Lodge**

#### Custer State Park

Set in a beautiful mountain valley and surrounded by a ponderosa pine forest, this gracious stone and wood lodge served as the "Summer White House" for President Calvin Coolidge in 1927 and was visited by President Dwight D. Eisenhower for several days in 1953. Built in 1920, the lodge is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Inside, you'll discover a blend of the past and the present, the elegant and the outdoors. Enjoy South Dakota specialties like buffalo, pheasant, and trout in the historic Lodge Dining Room.

Room Amenities: Climate control, flat screen TV, phone, coffee making facilities, and hair dryer.







#### Spearfish Canyon Lodge

#### Spearfish Canyon

Nestled alongside lofty pines and spectacular limestone cliffs, Spearfish Canyon Lodge was built and decorated in the style of the old lodges of the West with heavy log walls and a 40-foot stone fireplace. Several hiking trails outside the Lodge door allow visitors to experience the sights and sounds of nature firsthand as they meander through the forest to a Black Hills waterfall or hike to the rim of the canyon.

Room Amenities: Climate control, mini refrigerator, microwave, TV, phone, bathroom sundries, and hair dryer.







#### The Cody

Cody

Located near Cody Rodeo Arena and Old Trail Town, The Cody is a premier, eco-friendly luxury hotel, offering upscale amenities and comfort. Stroll along the beautiful grounds, take in the mountain views on the master patio with outdoor fireplace, rejuvenate in the hot tub, and enjoy the large indoor pool complete with a lap lane.

Room Amenities: Climate control, flat screen TV, DVD player, phone, microwave, refrigerator, safe, complimentary newspaper, coffee and tea making facilities, bathroom sundries, bath robe, and hair dryer.







#### Lake Yellowstone Hotel

Yellowstone National Park

Originally built in 1891 and restored in 1990, the classically elegant Lake Yellowstone Hotel is situated on the shores of North America's largest mountain lake. A spacious sunroom offers sweeping views of the lake at sunrise or sunset and a great spot to soak in the grandeur of the park's oldest hotel.

Room Amenities: Phone, coffee making facilities, bathroom sundries, and hair dryer.







#### Old Faithful Inn

Yellowstone National Park

Built during the winter of 1903-04, the Old Faithful Inn is one of the few remaining log hotels in the United States. The original part of the Inn, known as the "Old House" was completed in 1904 and includes an immense lobby with a huge stone fireplace. The East and West Wings were added in the teens and the twenties, with many rooms having been remodeled in recent years. Guest accommodations include rooms with private baths. A full service restaurant, deli, gift store and interpretive tours are also available at the Inn. A national historic landmark, Old Faithful Inn is an icon of Yellowstone.

Room Amenities: Phone, bathroom sundries, and hair dryer.







#### Mammoth Hot Springs Hotel

Yellowstone National Park

Established in 1911, the Mammoth Hot Springs hotel is situated below the steaming limestone terraces of the hot springs. Make sure you drift into the Map Room (named for the massive inlaid map of the United States on one of the walls); and keep your eye out for elk, which routinely graze outside the hotel around the grounds of what was once Fort Yellowstone.

Room Amenities: Phone, bathroom sundries, and hair dryer.







#### Old Faithful Snow Lodge

Yellowstone National Park

A short walk from its famous namesake, the Old Faithful Snow Lodge makes abundant use of natural wood and fixtures that harken back to historic Yellowstone lodges. The rooms are simple, comfortable, and outfitted with lodge details like wooden shutters over windows that open for fresh air.

Room Amenities: Phone, refrigerator, coffee and tea making facilities, bathroom sundries, and hair dryer.

#### Activity Level:

#### **Easy**

The majority of the program's activities will take place outdoors and a fair amount of walking on varying terrain is to be expected. Many of the parks have dirt trails, but they are usually fairly smooth for walking, some do have paved pathways and boardwalks. It is our expectation that guests on this program are able to walk a mile at a moderate pace and be able to walk up a flight of stairs without assistance. Also keep in mind that you will experience varying altitudes, rising up to 9000', to which you may not be accustomed.

Take advantage of Jackson Hole's world-class wildlife viewing, outdoor activities and the region's jaw-dropping scenery. Jackson itself is where much of the area's Old West heritage can be found, with mountain views from almost every corner.. On a half-day wildlife sightseeing excursion in Grand Teton Park, wildlife experts will guide you to the park's viewing hotspots while also providing details about the area's history, landmarks, and geography. #### ORBRIDGE TERMS AND CONDITIONS

These terms and conditions ("Agreement") apply to and control any travel services offered by or through Orbridge LLC or any of its Affiliates (together and in the alternative, "Orbridge", "we", "us", "our"). For purposes of this Agreement, the term "Affiliates" means any natural person or legal entity that is controlled by, controls, or is under common control with Orbridge. "Control" means the ability, whether directly or indirectly, to direct the affairs of Orbridge by means of ownership, contract, employment relationship or otherwise. "You" and "your" means each program participant.

Rates. Program rates are based on minimum participation levels, current fares (air, water, land), tariffs and currency values. While Orbridge does everything possible to maintain the listed program rates, they are subject to change effective immediately upon posting unless otherwise specified by Orbridge.

Registration, Deposits and Final Payment. To confirm and secure your reservation, a deposit of \$850 per person per program and \$500 per person per extension, payable by check, money order, wire transfer of same day US funds, or major credit card is due at the time of registration. Final payment including any extensions (s) is payable by check, money order, or wire transfer of same day US funds ONLY and due no later than 90 days prior to the scheduled program, plus any extension, is due at the time of registration by check, money order, or wire transfer of same day US funds ONLY. If final payment is not received by Orbridge at least 90 days prior to the scheduled program departure date, (a) the reservation is subject to a late payment fee equal to 2% for the maximum legal arte, if less) of the total invoice amount, per week until paid in full, and (b) Orbridge may, at any time and with or without notice, cancel your reservation in its sole and absolute discretion. All payments we receive from you are herein defined as "Payments".

Cancellations and Refunds.
