PORTS OF CALL

MYTILINI, LESVOS, GREECE

With a history shaped by Byzantines, Romans, Venetians and Turks thousands of years in the making, Mytilini is a fascinating city rich with historic architecture, from Belle Époque churches and Turkish mansions to an ancient Roman theater and imposing Byzantine castle. The capital of Lesvos is also a gateway to the island's scenic beauty—once known as the “Garden of the Aegean.”

EPHESUS/KUSADASI, TURKEY

The port of Kusadasi, until recently a fishing and farming village, is today a resort town offering splendid beaches and plenty of shops. Nearby is the legendary ruined city of Ephesus, a veritable museum of Greek and Roman history with impeccably preserved relics from its ancient past. Here you'll find the Library of Celsus, the incredible Terraced Houses, and the remains of the Temple of Artemis—one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World.

RHODES, GREECE

Rich in history and steeped in legend, the largest of the Dodecanese (or Twelve Islands) is located on the eastern edge of the Aegean Sea. Home to an ancient acropolis, whitewashed towns and the medieval walled city known as Rhodes Town, the island's idyllic scenery is of equal splendor—dreamy beaches and an average of more than 300 days of sunshine each year.

BODRUM, TURKEY

From its sugar-white buildings fringed by fragrant bougainvillea to its palm-lined streets bursting with charming shops and outdoor cafes, this magnetic Turkish resort brims with beauty and character. In addition to breathtaking bay views, Bodrum also offers its visitors unique attractions, including the ruins of the Mausoleum of Halicarnassus, formerly one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World, and the superb Museum of Underwater Archaeology.

AGIOS NIKOLAOS, CRETE, GREECE

For centuries, the beauty of Agios Nikolaos has attracted visitors as a popular getaway. The town's charming harbor and small, picturesque lagoon, Lake Voulismeni, affords a beautiful panorama accented by the town's gorgeous beaches. The town is also a gateway to Crete's striking natural landscapes dotted with lovely Byzantine villages, quaint windmills and ancient Minoan palaces, including the legendary Palace of Knossos.

SANTORINI, GREECE

Famed for its spectacular sunsets, the island's distinctive crescent shape is the result of an enormous volcanic eruption thousands of years ago. Behold a panorama of indigo-domed churches and chalk-colored homes clinging to stony cliffs along the caldera, black sand beaches dotted with pebbles beside deep, azure waters, and breathtaking rock formations climbing from the volcanic floor—here is the epitome of Grecian beauty.

MYKONOS, GREECE

Amid the shimmering waters of the Mediterranean is the heart and soul of the Cyclades: Mykonos. Situated on an island of the same name, the town artfully balances glitz, glamour and classic Greek culture with its labyrinth of cobblestone streets and chalk-white houses beside classic blue-domed churches.

THESSALONIKI, GREECE

Situated at the north end of the Gulf of Thermaïkós, Greece's second-largest city was a major cultural and trading center when it was founded by King Cassander of Macedonia in 315 BC. Today, this cosmopolitan metropolis draws visitors with its alluring mix of roman remnants, Byzantine churches, Ottoman structures, glorious beaches, sophisticated restaurants and a collection of notable museums, including the Museum of Byzantine Culture and the Archaeological Museum.
