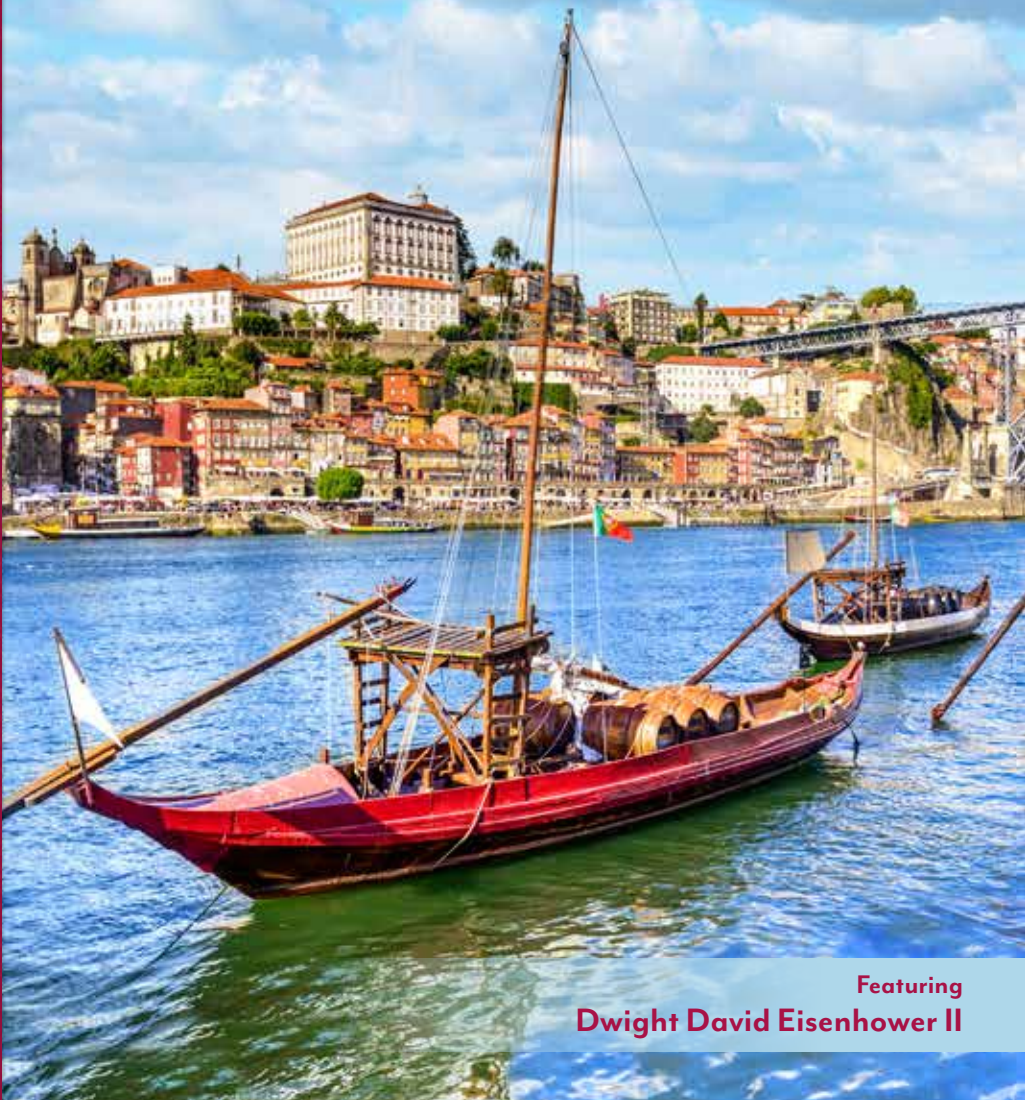




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

Dwight David Eisenhower II

Grandson of General and President Dwight D. Eisenhower, Dwight David Eisenhower II is a noted historian of World War II and the Cold War. His 1986 bestseller, *Eisenhower: At War 1943–1945*, was a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize in

History. Eisenhower received a B.A. in history cum laude from Amherst College. Following graduation, he served in the United States Naval Reserve for three years as an officer on the USS Albany; shortly afterward, he earned his J.D. cum laude from The George Washington University Law School. Today, Eisenhower is Senior Fellow of the Foreign Policy Research Institute and a Public Policy Fellow at the Annenberg School of Communication and the School of Arts and Sciences at the University of Pennsylvania, where he teaches “Communication and the Presidency.”

A Mystical Pilgrimage

The mystical story of Santiago de Compostela begins in the ninth century when a hermit named Pelagius reported seeing a field of stars that led him to an ancient tomb containing three bodies — that of Saint James the Great, one of Jesus' apostles, and two of his followers. It is believed that the body of Saint James (also known as Santiago, the patron saint of Spain) was carried to the coast after his death in 44 A.D. and put in a stone boat that was guided by angels to Padrón and then transported to the tomb that Pelagius would be miraculously called to more than 800 years later. Christian pilgrims soon began following the Camino de Santiago pathway to repent for their sins and visit the tomb at Santiago de Compostela. Today, this UNESCO-designated site is one of the most sacred pilgrimage destinations in the world. Your Santiago de Compostela excursion includes a tour of the old town and a visit to the hallowed sanctuary of the martyred saint. Marvel at the Romanesque and Baroque styles in its interior and see the silver urn that contains Saint James' ashes.

Day 1 | May 3

Depart your home city on an overnight flight to Portugal.

Lisbon, Portugal/Embark World Traveller

Day 2 | May 4

Arrive in Lisbon and transfer to a group hospitality room and enjoy lunch on your own. Later this afternoon, embark the deluxe **World Traveller**. (D)

Leixões for Porto

Day 3 | May 5

Dock in Leixões and transfer to Porto, a former Roman outpost and center of port wine trade since the 13th century. The cultural legacy of the Moors finds expression in Porto's rich architectural details.

Enjoy a guided walking tour of medieval Ribeira, Porto's historical center, declared a UNESCO World Heritage site for its living history status.

After lunch you may choose from one of two included activities. You may opt to taste some of Porto's famous port wine with cheese at a local winery. A second option is a tour of its medieval monuments, including the 19th-century Stock Exchange Palace — a grand building with British Neoclassical and Palladian influences. Inside you will find elaborate paintings, sculptures and décor of the period.

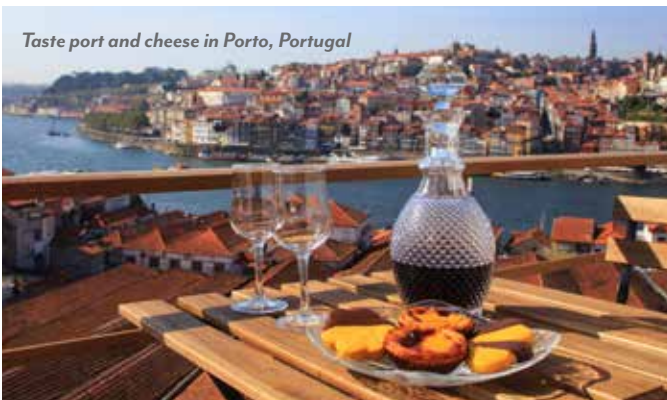

A Coruña, Spain, for Santiago de Compostela

Day 4 | May 6

Visit the UNESCO World Heritage site of Santiago de Compostela and stroll

Santiago Calatrava and Philippe Starck redefined the post-industrial skyline. An afternoon excursion in the city will give you two options for included activities. Take a panoramic tour of Bilbao, then choose between touring the Guggenheim's renowned art collection or

along medieval stone streets to the Praza do Obradoiro square — flanked by the glorious Romanesque cathedral. As a pilgrimage site since the Middle Ages, the cathedral enshrines the tomb of Saint James and is recognized for its carved Baroque façade, original medieval portico and Churrigueresque altar. Day 5 | May 7

Frank Gehry's titanium-clad Guggenheim Museum hailed Bilbao's cultural renaissance as modernist marvels from

Day 6 | May 8

Saint-Malo, France, for Mont-Saint-Michel

Day 7 | May 9

Rising from a tidal plain that appears to be suspended above the sea, the UNESCO World

Heritage-designated Mont-Saint-Michel is a sight of soaring spires isolated beyond a stretch of saltwater marsh.

This fortified village began as a humble oratory and became a renowned medieval center of learning. Cobblestone streets weave through the village, culminating in the Abbaye du Mont-Saint-Michel, a three-story Gothic masterpiece. Admire the serene cloisters, barrel-roofed réfectoire and Salle des Hôtes of the 13th-century La Merveille and the magnificent Église Abbatiale. (B,L,D)

Caen for the Normandy Beaches

Day 8 | May 10

Travel to Caen and make the solemn pilgrimage with Professor David Eisenhower to the historic Normandy beaches,

site of the largest seaborne invasion in history.

After lunch, opt to continue to Arranches to see the remnants of the Mulberry “A” harbor that was taken across the English Channel to support Allied landings on the Normandy beaches or choose to see the 230-foot-long Bayeux Tapestry, which chronicles the Norman Conquest of 1066. (B,L,D)

Cruising the English Channel/River Thames, London, England

Day 9 | May 11

Attend a lecture on board this morning as you cruise the English Channel across the Strait of Dover and continue up the River Thames, a memorable passage possible only by small ship.

See Britain’s history revealed as you pass the towering skyline and take in monumental views of Greenwich’s Observation Tower, the Tower of London, Norman Foster’s emerald-hued Gherkin and Renzo Piano’s sky-piercing Shard.

Dock overnight alongside a famous D-Day-era warship in view of the Tower Bridge and admire the evening views. Attend the Captain’s Farewell Reception this evening. (B,L,D,R)

London/Disembark ship/Return to Home City

Day 10 | May 12

Following breakfast, disembark and continue to the London Post-Tour Extension or transfer to the airport for your return flight home. (B,L,D)
